Sustainable Sunningdale

The log boiler kept us nicely warm during this bitter winter and we are grateful to all who gave us wood. Our other renewable installation is the solar thermal. Together both installations enabled us to reduce energy used during the coldest months by 328 units over the previous year. Our electric heating might have been much higher given the long cold winter. More spectacular energy reductions were achieved in the flat where the day rate of electricity fell by a quarter, and the gas bill fell from £128 to just £7.58 for the same winter months this year.
