News from the Parish Council

The work of the Parish Council in improving Sunningdale continues. A new notice board will be erected very soon at the Chobham Road sponsored by Coworth Park, enabling us to tell you more of what is going on locally.

Thanks to Inspired Facilities grant of £35,000 we will be installing flood lights on the tennis courts so we can extend the hours of play.

Our ever-popular recreation ground has benefitted by weedkilling, fertilising and reseeding which has greatly improved the grass on which many games are played throughout the year. You will notice the new goals and will soon see the new mower which is an essential upgrade.

Major work will be done during August to reduce the Willow trees at the Rec as they have become very large and liable to breakage in windy conditions. Also groundwork will be undertaken in the corner of the playground to drain surface water away to the stream so making the footpath and playground less waterlogged. This will be paid for from S106 Developers Contribution.



Neighbourhood Plan

The community volunteers for our local Neighbourhood Plan continue to explore what it is our community wants and needs, including where most appropriately we can put future housing to meet the targets that the Borough sets for this area. The four task groups (Housing & the Environment, Economy, Community and Transport & Infrastructure) are working together to explore the best options for possible uses of some of the major sites, and developing ideas for the improvement of Sunningdale and Ascot.

In Sunningdale we are discussing parking needs, retail opportunities and sites for housing, as well as the possible impact of the DERA site on Chobham Common. It is not too late to get involved and to help us with some of the work of evidence gathering required to back up the Plan and show the Inspectors that our ideas are solidly based.
