Sunningdale Area Carnival

Council has ordered 5 **new planters** to be erected down the central reservation of the A30 as you approach the level crossing. This will brighten and enhance this area – arriving later in June as they have had to be specially made. And, thanks to the generosity of 26 Sunningdale retailers and the Parish Council, 90 Bloom hanging baskets are up again throughout the village to make it a colourful place to visit.

A **Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment** recycling bank is to be placed by the Borough at the Rec – all part of the efforts to improve recycling.

Parking. Borough Councillor Christine Bateson and the Parish Council have been making a determined effort to overcome the parking problem in the Shoppers Car Park. A machine is being installed to enable 40 places to be reserved for 3 hour parking (free) and the remaining spaces allocated with permits to the businesses. This will keep out commuters and coach parties and ensure shoppers can park.

Sustainable Sunningdale continues to encourage residents to create garden spaces to protect our bees, and it works with Wildlife in Ascot and ASCENT (Ascot Community Environment Network) to see what actions we can take to mitigate the impact of climate change. You have 6 weeks to comment on the Plan. This is the product of two years of hard work by a group of volunteers. Please do read it all to see the policies which will shape the future development in our area and protect its character.

Your comments will be listened to and at the end of the consultation period, the Plan will be reviewed in the light of these comments. By early September the Plan in its final form is to be submitted to the Borough to go through the lengthy processes of examination and scrutiny. If approved – with or without any further amendments suggested by the Examiner – it will be put to a vote by local residents in a public referendum where it will require a straight majority to become planning policy. So please do read it and send in your comments.

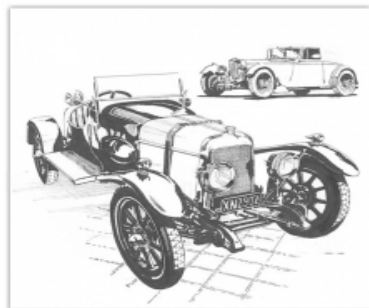
Circus Normandie – 4-6 July at the Recreation Ground

Clean Up Sunningdale

The Parish Council in close collaboration with the Borough is pleased to have made significant steps to clean up Sunningdale. We started in the Chobham Road with the replacement planters which made a bright splash of colour, and the repainting of the Telephone Box which the Parish Council has adopted. We have obtained money from the Participatory Budget to improve the pavement around the phone box and have asked the Borough to prioritise the repaving outside Hyperion to No 45. Council persuaded Royal Mail to repaint the letter boxes outside Waitrose and Barclays Bank.

You will undoubtedly have noticed the transformed corner on the A30/ Chobham Road junction where the Borough reclaimed their land to ensure that residents, old and young, could cross safely that busy junction. The final task is the rebuilding of the wall around the Jubilee Clock which was destroyed by an extremely long vehicle turning right.
