Weight Restriction Petition

The Parish Council is calling on residents and road users to support its petition to further restrict the size and weight of lorries using Chobham Road. The petition is in response to a marked increase in traffic, particularly heavy goods vehicles (HGVs), travelling along the Chobham Road (B383). The Parish Council is also concerned that construction traffic from the planned DERA development at Longcross will routinely use Chobham Road.

The Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead introduced an 18 tonne weight limit in June after it acknowledged that with its shops, houses and street parking, heavy lorries should not use this road. However, the Parish Council is now campaigning to reduce the weight limit to 7.5 tonnes due to the difficulty in identifying lorries 18 tonnes and over and its ongoing safety concerns regarding HGVs having to cross the central white lines when travelling over the Chobham Road bridge and poor sight lines for oncoming traffic.

Recycling Food Waste - It really does make a difference

Over a year the average family throws away around \pm 700 of food shopping, including perfectly good food – that is about \pm 60 a month. If we stopped wasting food that could have been eaten it would have the same impact as taking 1 in 4 cars off the road.

The RBWM weekly food waste recycling collection service makes the most of any food waste you do have by using it to create electricity and fertiliser. It also avoids food waste ending up in the general rubbish, which is sent to landfill where it quickly generates methane, a greenhouse gas that is 23 times more potent than carbon dioxide and contributes to global warming and climate change. It is not just the methane that is released when the food goes to landfill that is the problem but also the energy spent producing, and transporting food




Making the most of your food waste collection Food waste collected in the black food caddies is used to produce compost for local farms and turned into biogas which is converted to electricity and fed to the National Grid.

RBWM food waste collection provides you with a small indoor caddy and a larger outdoor caddy with a lockable handle, which is emptied by the Refuse Collection team on Tuesdays, the normal recycling day. This is an important step in looking after our environment.

Improvements at the Recreation Ground

In the main playground a new Climbing frame (below) will be erected and two additional pieces of equipment – chosen to add new challenges and enjoyment for the children.
