Save our Sunningdale

Sunningdale Parish Council is committed to protecting the character of our village as well as the viability of our shops and businesses.

It is very concerned that the proposals will result in increased congestion and a loss of badly needed car parking spaces as well as deterring residents and visitors from using Sunningdale's amenities.

Chobham Road and Broomhall Road junction traffic lights

Sunningdale Parish Council supports its retailers and businesses in their concern for:

- The character of our village, keeping it convenient for shopping and parking, and resisting urbanisation, faster vehicle movements and more traffic signs.
- The proposed traffic scheme will increase congestion due to the proximity of both sets of proposed traffic lights to the Sunningdale railway level crossing which services daily 100 trains, 13,991 vehicles and more than 800 cyclists and pedestrians (Network Rail consensus).
- Several car parking spaces will be lost on Chobham Road which will have a detrimental impact on the nearby shops and businesses reliant on customers being able to park.

Residents and visitors to be charged to park in Sunningdale

The Royal Borough planned to introduce car parking charges in the Sunningdale car park, but will now be consulting with the public prior to implementation.

Sunningdale businesses and Sunningdale Parish Council are worried this will deter residents and visitors from shopping and eating out in the village.

Weight limit of 7.5 tonnes over the Chobham Road Bridge is not being enforced.

In order to enforce this, the Borough in conjunction with the Parish Council seek to introduce a Lorry Watch scheme which will involve recording those vehicles which are breaching the weight restriction, for the Borough Council to follow up on compliance. Volunteers are needed for the Lorry Watch.
