You get a sizeable wheelie bin which is easy to use, saves you time and energy and can be stored neatly in a corner of your garden.

All you need to do is put your bin out once a fortnight for collection. This will leave you time to sit back and enjoy your garden.

We collect flowers, plants, grass cuttings, leaves, hedge trimmings, most weeds, small branches and we recycle all green waste into environmentally friendly fertiliser.



### What can you put in your recycling bin at home?

# please

You can recycle almost all of your everyday food and drink packaging.

- Glass
- Metal
- Paper
- Card
- Plastics




However there are a few exceptions so please place these items in your general rubbish bin.



### No thanks Shiny foil gift wrap & greeting cards with glitter

These items must be put in your general rubbish bin as they cannot be recycled





Glass cookware e.g pyrex

Drinking glasses e.g wine glasses & tumblers



Polystyrene e.g pizza bases, packaging inserts

Dirty & stained paper & card



Foil coated lids on yoghurt pots

Foil lined food pouches e.g. baby food, coffee pouches



Plastic bags e.g. carrier bags, plastic food bags, bubble wrap Plastic film e.g. cling film, plastic film on meat & fish trays

### \* The scrunch test

To make sure your item can be recycled, try to scrunch it - if it springs back it is foil coated with plastic and we can't recycle it.



Your recycling should be put in the bin loose, so just empty out any plastic bags and reuse them, or pop them in your general rubbish bin or check to see if your local supermarket recycles them.



Empty and rinse - items don't need to be spotlessly clean, a quick rinse will do. Left over liquid and residue can contaminate other items which may mean they are not recycled.

Your recycling bin is mainly for packaging so please no clothes, textiles, plastic toys or wood.

## What can I do with unwanted textiles?



You can now recycle all your old clothes & textiles from your doorstep



clothes

We can only collect one bag at a time each week from each house.



- Clothing
- · Socks
- Shoes (paired)
- Belts
- Unwanted handbags
- Knitwear
- Curtains
- Blankets
- Towels
- Bedding

We cannot collect duvets or pillows



Simply place your clean, dry clothes and textiles in any plastic bag, tie the bag, label it or write on the bag 'textiles' and then place it next to your bins on collection day.

Please don't place the bag in your recycling bin, but leave it out separately.

A separate vehicle is being used to collect your bags of textiles and may come either before or after all your bins have been emptied.

As all materials must be clean and dry, try and avoid placing them out for collection in bad weather.





### **Charity shops & collections**

Please do continue to donate your clothes in good condition to charity. You can still use the textile service for any torn and stained items.

All your old clothes and textiles will either be reused or shredded and made into new products such as filling for mattresses, furniture and cars.

# recycle your food waste?

It's easier, cheaper and it really does make a difference.

### Line your indoor caddy

You no longer need to use compostable bin liners and can use any plastic bag. Alternatively you can pick up a **FREE roll of food waste bags** from your local library or from the Maidenhead Town Hall.



You can buy your own indoor caddy to suit your kitchen or improvise with plastic containers such as ice-cream tubs



## Emptying your caddy

Once the bag is almost full, tie the bag and place the bag of food waste in your outdoor food recycling bin.

If you no longer have your outdoor bin or it is damaged, please contact us for a new one.

### Remember

To put your food bin out for collection along with your other bins.

Do remember to keep your outdoor bin locked using the lockable handle.

You can also put your food waste directly into your outdoor food bin either loose or wrapped in newspaper.



## What food can I recycle in my caddy

You can include food in your recycling bin that you can't compost at home, including raw and cooked meat and fish.

## What happens to my recycling?



### Paper & Card

All the paper and card you recycle is made into new newspaper and cardboard.





### Mixed Glass, Bottles & Jars

All the glass bottles and jars you recycle are made into new glass products and aggregate.





### **Plastic Packaging**

All of the plastics you recycle are turned into new bottles, jars and toys.





### Metals

All metal you recycle remains in the UK and is turned into new metal products such as drinks cans or even part of your washing machine.





#### **Food Waste**

All food waste you recycle is turned into fertiliser for farms locally and into biogas which is converted to electricity and fed to the National Grid.





#### **Garden Waste**

All garden waste you recycle is turned into fertiliser for farms locally.






#### **Textiles**

All textiles and unwanted clothes you recycle are used for filling in car seats and upholstery.



## What can I put in my general rubbish bin?





The sort of things you might put in your general rubbish bin are:

- Plastic bags & film
- Nappies
- Pet bedding
   & cat litter
- Foil coated food pouches, crisp
   & sweet packets
- Polystyrene
- Broken crockery
   & glassware



You cannot put these items into your general rubbish bin:

- Electrical items
- DIY or builders waste
- Turf & soil
- Batteries
- Oil cans & engine oil
- Paint tins
- Mirrors & sheet glass
- Light bulbs
- Gas bottles



These items and any other items that cannot be recycled at home will need to be taken to your local waste and recycling centre.

Please do not put garden waste, food or unwanted clothes in your general rubbish bin.

greenredeem rewarding action

The Greenredeem scheme rewards you and your local community for recycling. It's really simple – the more you recycle the more points you earn.



You can then choose how you reward yourself. The scheme offers rewards from a wide variety of national and local shops and businesses and also gives you the opportunity to support your local school and good causes.

Residents with wheelie bins have their bins weighed as they're collected. The weight is turned into Greenredeem points and credited shortly afterwards.

If you don't have your own wheelie bin, and recycle in a communal bin, then you can still earn points for recycling. Just tell Greenredeem once a week on the website, smartphone app, or call them.

You'll get 10 points per week and a share of the points for the weight recycled in the community.

Greenredeem is available to all residents in the borough.



### Home composting

We have teamed up with Get Composting to provide reduced price compost bins.

Green garden waste and vegetable and fruit peelings can be turned into a rich compost to keep your garden blooming year after year.

Anything you can't compost can be put in your food waste bin for recycling.
