



Roads in the village

Improve lighting in the alleyway between the London Road car park and Dominoes as well as improve the pavement surface, and signage for the car park. Or have an advertising 'campaign' to improve knowledge of the car park's existance. Many people seem to be unaware of the pathway from car park to Pelican crossing ... get a decent sign saying "shops this way". Have regular community officer checks on parking on Chobham Rd to stop double parking and parking on double yellow outside the bike shop which causes additional issues for traffic at that pinch point

Pot holes

It is almost impossible to walk around sunningdale after dark with lack of street lighting (that could be switched off I.e. midnight to 6am), pavements being uneven & covered in wet leaves for the majority of the winter months.

Better lighting on Broomhall lane on bend by farm and between Station Road and London Rd junctions. Walk way/footpath from station to Dry Arch Road needs improvement- overgrown and fence frequently knocked or fallen over

Could you please consider the installation of an additional lamppost on the junction of Cedar Drive and Broomhall Lane as it's dangerous trying to cross the road when you can't see the kerb.

There is places around Sunningdale that's had poor street lighting, this in turn has lead to a rise in burglaries in Rodgemount. Can a few lights be build from CIL please.

To reduce traffic congestion & improve parking availability. Provide more cycle paths & cycle parking in all shopping & recreational locations. Provide a footpath or other means of a footway under the railway at Dry Arch Road.

COMMENTS

The pavement past the farm on Broomhall Lane slopes towards the road! It is incredibly difficult to manoeuvre a buggy safely along there and must be almost impossible to push a wheelchair there. Please would you arrange for a s

More or improved pump stations. Traffic calming in Charters Road before a school child becomes a statistic!

Entry into Larch Avenue since the pavement has been widened means you can no longer turn right with a short view of oncoming traffic. It's a death trap. Silwood Road must be widened and it's junction at the top should be a roundabout. Currently many use the left hand branch intended for those travelling to Ascot, to turn right shortening the queuing time but preventing those correctly queuing from making their turn. RIDICULOUS and once the increased traffic from the new buildings in Larch Avenue are occupied, it's going to be a lot worse. Invest here please

The walk way from the Broomhall Park tennis court car park to the bridge over the stream needs to be repaired, as its now disappeared due to grass infiltration! Also, Sunningdale Station is looking very tired and needs a refurbishment or replacement. It's not a good advert for Sunningdale when visitors arrive!

COMMENTS

There needs to be protection from increased traffic in small roads due to developments. Over in the Sunningdale Village we residents cannot see how our small roads are expected to cope once nearby new housing is fully occupied. We are already seeing our roads being used for parking for Windsor Park now that there are further restrictions and parking fees there. This increase in outsiders' use is changing the nature of our streets that were until recently quiet and safe. Please consider introducing residents parking off pavements (I add this as its sometimes impossible for disabled people and pushchairs to negotiate pavements in the village).

Please use the money to sweep pavements and roads during autumn. The leaf litter blocks drains and roads flood, and makes pavements impossible to walk along safely.


Stop people parking on verges & paths


