1. Welcome

4. Cycling and Walking vision

5. Sunningdale Park Suitable Alternative Natural Greenspace (SANG) access

Frederick Hill from Berkeley Homes provided the meeting with the information on the opening of the SANG for use by the residents. The PowerPoint includes the details of the access points, which Frederick confirmed access was planned from:

- May 2023 Access via North Silwood Road with carparking for 14 visitors

- May 2023 Pedestrian access via South Lodge
- Sept 2023 Pedestrian access via Gardeners Cottages
- 2026 tbc Last phase via Larch Avenue

6. A Road to Safer Streets

7. Questions and Answer Session

Q: Why was Chobham Road not included in the list of 20mph streets? Would it not be possible to do from the A30 junction to the railway bridge?

A: The roads which were nominated did not include Chobham Road, however, this would be reviewed and if possible added, thank you.

Q: The night time speed of travel is more than 40mph on the A30. Will this be addressed?

A: This will be investigated and if possible, action taken.

Q: Bedford Lane from the A30 along the High Street has become a cut through with speeds more than 50mph, is it possible to install speed bumps?

A: Sunningdale Parish Council will take this up with Thames Valley Police and see where speed traps can be set up to monitor these roads. If there is consistent speeding, then actions can be looked at.

Q: Have you investigated Cycle hire and bike racks as part of the Safer Streets project?

A: This is a good idea, and the council will investigate the feasibility of this.
