CB suggested flagging up spaces which are "demonstrably special" to the community. For key areas: gather evidence, local people to say which areas are unique and need protecting. Examples can include allotments, playing fields and village greens. N.B. these sites don't have to be accessible to the general public, but they should have particular standing and importance.</li> <li>CB also stated that this designation gives the same level of protection as green belt.
