3	Officer time availability and commitment to the project. Estimated time required has been calculated at 14 hours per week however this needs to be verified with a Neighbourhood Plan consultant to confirm how much work is needed to be done through the parish councils and how much work is done by the consultants themselves and the lobby groups. Resource time by the officers will need to be reviewed / created in some way however this is to be discussed at a later point when more information is available on the work involved.
